Forum Purpose (s):

Overarching Purpose: The FORUM is intended to provide an annual process for information sharing and discussion on Fraser salmon fisheries issues between DFO and First Nations (Tier 2) and First Nations with other First Nations (Tier 1).

December FORUM Purpose: The intent of this meeting is to start by having a discussion between DFO and First Nations on the FORUM process. The hope is that by starting off by addressing some of the issues from 2014 we can arrive at a common understanding of the process in order to commence discussions for 2015 on a positive note. This FORUM will also provide some preliminary information on 2014 salmon fisheries and some information to initiate thinking about fishery planning for 2015.
