Forum Purpose(s):

Overarching Purpose: The FORUM is intended to provide an annual process for information sharing and discussion on Fraser salmon fisheries issues between DFO and First Nations (Tier 2) and First Nations with other First Nations (Tier 1). First Nation attendees have the opportunity to provide their advice and recommendations on management plans.

December FORUM Purpose: The intent of this meeting is to provide post-season information from 2018, provide updates on a broad suite of fisheries processes and to initiate thinking about fishery planning for 2019.

exploitation rates for IFR coho will not be available until March 2018. Chum information will include the final in-season run-size estimate from the Albion test fishery and preliminary catch data. Chinook, Coho, and Chum escapement information for 2018 should be available by April 2019.
