

Tier 2: (DFO and First Nations)
Consultation

Tier 1: (First Nations only)
Mandated governance body.

FRAFS:

The structure through which DFO
encourages and supports consultation.

Includes the **Joint Technical Working Group**: biologists and technicians from DFO and First Nations working as peers.

FSMC:

The structure by which First Nations will enter into negotiations with DFO.

The goal: a management agreement over Fraser salmon.

FRAFS Executive Committee

First Nations Membership:
Two each from the upper, mid and lower Fraser; and the Chair.
Selected by First Nations.
DFO: two Aboriginal Advisors.

FSMC Main Table

Elected, by region,
by FSMC Member Delegates:
Two each from the upper, mid and lower Fraser; and three from the Marine Approach area.

Terms of Reference (TOR)

FSMC Constitution and By-laws (2014)

Forum on Conservation and Harvest Planning.

Tier 1 / Tier 2 discussions result in a letter of technical advice to the RDG
re: IFMP.

FSMC Assembly:

Consensus decision-making
on Resolutions. Quorum required.

Forum Attendees:

First Nations that fish or rely on Fraser salmon (ex.: FSC; economic opportunities) and DFO representatives.

FSMC Member Delegates:

Appointed by Council Resolution.
One per First Nation. They represent the Rights Holder.
